**Note:** the AGE column in the table above refers to the age the skater is turning in the year of the competition (that is, in the calendar year beings 1st of January through to and including the 31st of December, in the year of the competition).

For pairs and couple dance, the category will be determined by the age of on the oldest partner.

## **NOTES FOR THE COMPETITIVE STRUCTURE**

### **UNLESS SPECIFIED OTHERWISE THESE RULES COVER ALL DISCIPLINES OF ARTISTIC ROLLER SKATING**

1. All competitors in FARS Events must be fully paid up members of the Federation of Artistic Roller Skating (FARS)
  2. All entries, must be received by the office a minimum of two (2) calendar months prior to the date of the event. No late entries will be accepted.
  3. All Championship entries are controlled by age, including Inline.
  4. The standard of a skater is on the closing date for entries. Any forthcoming tests will not be taken into consideration.
  5. All ages quoted within the structure are "skating ages". In the case of Dance and Pairs events, the age used for the calculation will be that of the eldest partner. If during the season the partnership splits, then in the following season the respective partners can re-enter at the level at which their age dictates. The skating age is the age of a skater in the year in which the events take place.
  6. The structure allows all skaters to skate one Championship in any one season; as set by their age. NOTE: There is no restriction on entering both the Junior and Senior Championships (including the Solo Dance Championships) in the same year, but once a skater has entered a Senior Championship, they cannot go back to the Junior event in subsequent years.
  7. In the case of Figure and Free Skating Championships, skaters can enter just one of the disciplines if they wish to do the single discipline.
  8. The compulsory figures in FARS events will be skated on circles of 6 metres in diameter.
  9. Music for FARS events must be sent digitally before the event. Clubs must take the appropriate steps to ensure that the music recording levels have been maximised and that the music provided is clear and is the correct version. Full instructions of how to do this will be sent to all clubs – any music not complying with these instructions will be rejected. 1 (one) USB per club should be brought to the venue containing all the club's music as a backup, the USB should be clearly marked with the clubs name. FARS can only accept MP3 format.
  10. The Board of FARS may decide to split the Event by age, if necessary, after the closing date. The order of skating in both Long and Free Dance programmes will be determined by a redraw in groups if necessary, based upon the result calculated by the FARS Artistic system following the short programme or Style Dance.
  11. For all Solo Dance Events LADIES STEPS will be skated unless specified.
  12. Music: Style Dance – It is mandatory to present before the Dance competition a certificate to confirm:
    1. The rhythms used
    2. The number of BPM of the Compulsory Dance Sequence(s)
- FARS will arrange verification of Style Dance, information will be sent to all clubs when this service is open.
13. There is no restriction on skaters entering both their respective Solo and Couples Dance Events.
  14. FARS reserves the right to refuse admission to any FARS Event.
  - 15. The skating surface will be cleaned between events where needed. No person is permitted to enter the skating rink to pick up stones at anytime.**
  - 16. All championships will be judged using the Rollart judging system where applicable.**

FARS A Competition : 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> April 2020 at UEA, Norwich

Championships : 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup>/19<sup>th</sup> July 2020 at Kettering Arena Sports

The FARS A Competition (April) and the FARS Championship (July) events will be run by Age under the World Skate age categories and rules. Entry requirements for Freeskating will be moving towards minimum RollArt Qualification Score but in order to make the transition smooth FARS will support both Test Standards and Qualification Score in 2020. A skater may enter an event if they are of the correct Age and they hold the required Test Standard OR RollArt Qualification Score. Entry requirements for Figures will remain by Test Standard.

### **Entry Qualifications:**

In order to qualify for entry to the freeskating events above, the skater must hold either the Test Standard or the RollArt Qualification Score shown for their category. A personal best RollArt score may be used without any limitation on when it was achieved. However, the score must have been achieved at a recognised FARS or international event judged with RollArt as the primary judging system. PDF evidence should be submitted at the time of entry where Qualification Score is used as the basis for entry.

## PROMOTIONAL COMPETITION

### Dates

13<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup> June 2020 at Kettering Arena Sports

The Promotional competition will be held for those skaters who are not eligible for the A events of the FARS Competition in April or Championships in July. Skaters may enter a specific discipline in either the Promotional competition **OR** FARS Comp/Championships but not both due to time limitations. **However, for clarification, a skater may enter one discipline in the Promotional competition and a different discipline in FARS Comp/Championships (e.g. Promotional Figures, Championship Free).**

## **Freeskating**

The FARS Promotional Freeskating events will be run by skating ability under new ability levels 1 to 7. Each level will be capped in terms of allowable elements and will be judged under the World Skate rules Tots to Senior. There are no minimum entry requirements for these events, however, skaters may not perform technical elements outside of those listed below for each category. Illegal Element Deductions will be made in such situations. FARS reserve the right to move skaters into lower level events if entries in an event are deemed too low.

### **CLARIFICATION – AGE & ABILITY:**

Please note that the events listed above are organised by ability level and NOT by age. We have given the corresponding World Skate Rules category for each level to confirm which rules will be used when judging the event, however, this does not limit skaters based on age. Skaters of any age may enter any Level providing they stick to the Maximum Elements Allowed. Skaters may enter any Promotional event, but FARS strongly recommends that the skater's ability accurately matches the elements allowed. These are not "required" elements but RollArt can be harsh if elements are performed poorly. For example, a jump which is deemed downgraded will receive very low scores. Likewise, a spin that is not in the correct position for the minimum revolutions will receive NO VALUE. Please choose your event wisely. ### **HOW TO USE THIS TABLE:**

- 1) Find the Level that best matches the skater's ability based on the Maximum Elements Allowed**  
For example, if a skater can perform a clean or very good attempt at a Three Jump (1W), Toe Loop (1T), Salchow (1S) and an Upright Spin (U) then they would be most suited to Level 1a. If they can perform a Flip (1F) and Lutz (1Lz) also then Level 1b would be more suitable. A Sit Spin (S) and a Loop (1L) as well would mean that Level 1c may be better for them.
- 2) Check the contents of the World Skate Rules column for your chosen Level**  
This will tell you what kind of program should be skated for that Level. The whole Level (or event) will be judged using the World Skate rules for that category plus additional rules which govern the Maximum Elements Allowed. For example, if Level 1b is selected, the skater should skate a Tots program regardless of their age. In addition to the normal World Skate rules for Tots, the skater may only perform the elements stated in the Max Elements Allowed column. In the case of Level 1b this would be a Three Jump (1W), Toe Loop (1T), Salchow (1S), Flip (1F), Lutz (1Lz) and an Upright Spin (U). Any elements above these in difficulty would attract a 1.0 point Illegal Element deduction.
- 3) Check the contents of the Short Program and Long Program columns for your chosen Level**  
A Short program will be required if "Yes" appears in the Short Program column for your chosen level. A Long program will be required if "Yes" appears in the Long Program column for your chosen level. Please refer to the World Skate rules for program length and requirements.
